



## Share your thoughts on how to help PortlandWiki grow and be more visible.

- 1. Perhaps reach out to other Portland online sites, especially in areas where PortlandWiki wants to improve or grow.
- 2. We need to be able to embed video. most of the viewed content on the web is video. Not link to YouTube. But a place to post video for original article.
- 3. To be more visible, Portland Wiki must be able to attract to several different viewers. Perhaps there should be themed pages, and each one, a separate person is able to admire (art, science, politics, etc). There should be the possibility for people to create their own blogs on Portland Wiki; as the website becomes more popular, so will people's blogs. Besides, it would create a unique and interesting basis for people to discover things they did not know about before. There should be more photos on the site (even though this is difficult), and there should possibly be a video on the front page that explains Portland Wiki's goals. There should also be an events space and a news space. Fonts should be bigger, there should be more icons, colors should be brighter, and Stumpy should definitely be included.
- 4. Don't forget that everyone who lives in and loves Portland isn't under 45. We "seasoned citizens" can contribute, broaden and will use this resource if given the right hooks
- 5. Appeal to the tech communities (user groups), government, via social media and other far reaching methods.
- 6. I'm not sure I want it to grow until I know what is is and how it will help the community. Is this just for marketing now? Are you capturing IPs?
- 7. See above. I feel like we should be wheat pasting posters like for protest marches. I think representatives of Portland Wiki should visit local orgs. Is there a page for individuals to reveal who they are and what they are all about? May be too much like Facebook, but I think the more community members know who the people are behind it, the more they will want to get on board with the fab organization of information a wiki provides.
- 8. Recruit various constituencies within the Portland community to cultivate and/or curate key knowledge resource areas of the wiki: neighborhoods, community resources, etc.
- 9. I had no idea you existed until the Silicon Florist post. I'm not super plugged in, but that's surprising.
- 10. Develop social networking pages to get the word out
- 11. Getting people to link to PortlandWiki from other sites (news, blogs, etc) seems to be the most important form of advertising.








### Please describe your ideal PortlandWiki meet-up or describe good meet-up models you have participated in elsewhere. Please include general location, day, and time.

- 1. I think the meetings should always be a friendly space, and there should be someone who takes the responsibility of greeting and chatting with new people so that they feel included. Also, I think consistent meeting places are good but perhaps a few times a year (quarterly?), these meetups could link up with other meetups like BeerNBlog or meet somewhere other than a coffee shop.
- 2. I have contributed a number of ideas for location on the wiki already.
- 3. I like the location and time a lot for the meet-ups we have now. Sometimes though, I think there should be a plan of what to talk about before anyone enters the meeting (maybe each meeting could focus on a different aspect of Portland Wlki). Even though it is also good to have discussions with people outside of the full group, I think that sometimes the group should talk as a whole and pose questions to everyone, so that no one misses anything. I love the community aspect of it, though.
- 4. I live in the burbs. Getting downtown is a hassle I have to be REALLY motivated to cope with. Perhaps "chapters" could meet in convenient locations around the Metro area with occasional "general" meetings to bring it all together
- 5. Identify areas to focus/bolster. Identify needs, identify outlines, fill in details.
- 6. M / W nights work great (except potentially for students in night classes). Location should be in Portland near the center of the city near mass transit. Love the idea of WIKI Weds! Laptops / smart phones should be available for every person (grant monies?). There should be like a "did you know?" demo about each members fave PDXWIKI page and why they like it. Also, things like aesthetics, outreach, connecting to social media, support for local social change work, should be discussed regularly. I think you guys should have some sort of lab / call for submissions for people who want to put up their own pages (with help and instruction in person).

#### 1. How often do you visit PortlandWiki?


